LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, START YOUR TRANSPLANTS!

February is the month to start seeding transplants. That's right, gardening season is officially in sight!
Tasks:

- 1. Feb 5th-begin seeding cold season transplants
- 2.Feb 12th-begin seeding warm season transplants
- 3. Feb 19th-direct seed peas, mustard, kale and collards
- 4. Feb 21st-prune blueberries, caneberries, and fruit trees
- 5. Throughout February:
 - a.consider applying <u>dormant oil</u> <u>sprays</u> to fruit trees to combat scale and other pests
 - b. <u>Prepare garden soil if it is dry</u> <u>enough</u>

FEBRUARY TASKS FROM THE LAWN MAINTENANCE CALENDAR

All Grass Types:

- <u>Select/acquire preemergence (PRE)</u> <u>herbicide to control summer weeds,</u> <u>particularly crabgrass.</u>
 - Look for herbicides that include active ingredients such as dithiopyr, pendimethalin, or prodiamine.
- <u>Have soil tested</u> to determine nutrient needs and build fertilizer program.
 - Visit <u>soillab.tennessee.edu</u>
 - Select/acquire fertilizer needed based on soil test results
- Have your mower serviced for the coming season, particularly blades (or reels and bedknives) sharpened and oil changed.
