## **Master Beef Producer Classes**

For the upcoming 2025 TAEP, anyone who has completed the Master Beef Producer Program or one of the other qualified master's programs in 2022 or after are current in their certification. **BQA is no longer required to apply for TAEP** and will become part of the Master Beef Producer Class. An approved master's certification will now be required at the time of re-imbursement and all TAEP grants will be paid at the 50% level. If you are not current in your certification or have never taken the class before we have a 2-day class option:

2 Day Version---Monday evening Sept. 22 and Tuesday all day Sept. 23. The location will be at the Middle Tennessee Research & Education Center in Spring Hill. On Tuesday we will use the Beef & Forage Field Day as part of our class.

The cost for the Face-to-Face Classes will be \$125.

## **Other Masters Options for Producers**

Master Farm Manager ---- Most likely there will be a face-to-face class offered in January and typically the state offers a virtual/hybrid class every year.

Master Farm Family Health & Wellness ---- Most Likely the state will offer a virtual/hybrid class in 2026.

Master Forage Producer ---- This is the newest master's program. Certification can be achieved in a variety of ways from attending planned Forage Field Days to virtual and hybrid options. Master Horse Owner --- Most likely the state will offer a virtual/hybrid class in 2026.

Master Row Crop Producer --- On-line virtual option available.

Master Commercial Poultry Producer --- On-line virtual option available.

Farming Fundamentals --- for those that would qualify for the "Beginning Farmer" -- there is an on-line virtual option and our SCET will most likely plan a face-to-face class in February.

## 2025-2026 TAEP Highlights

The 2025/26 TAEP Applications are now available to review online --- at the TAEP homepage

<u>www.tn.gov/taep</u>. Just like last year, applications can only be submitted online. There will be no paper booklet applications available, and producers will not be able to submit applications through regular mail. Applicants must have a valid email address, internet access and an electronic device to apply online. If you do not currently have an email address you can establish one or use a family member's address. **The TAEP application period is October 1-7.** For those who may need assistance in applying online you can contact the Extension Office at 762-5506 and schedule a time to come by for assistance.

Some notable changes to this year's program:

- 1. I. Equids (horses, donkeys & mules) have been added as an eligible livestock for Hay Storage, Livestock Equipment & Livestock Solutions. Applicants must operate a commercial equine business involved in breeding, training, and/or boarding and the minimum number of head required is 20.
- 2. 2. The Livestock Solutions program has reduced the minimum number of head required for beef cattle from 100 to 30 and small ruminant from 150 to 50.
- 3. Livestock trailers and rotary cutter/pasture clippers have been moved from the equipment program to the livestock solutions program. The length of livestock trailers has also been reduced to a minimum of 10 feet to better accommodate small ruminants and equine.
- 4. In the genetics program all bulls must now have eligible GE-EPD's between October 1, 2025 and date of purchase.

- 5. Hay Equipment minimum requirement is now based on 100 acres of hay production (1st cutting only).
- 6. 6. There are some other minor changes so be sure to thoroughly read application A to make sure you fully understand what is available.

## **Private Applicator Pesticide Certification**

\*\*\*Pesticide continuing education\*\*\*

For those of you with a Class 1 Private Applicator pesticide license, you likely have received a letter from the TN Department of Agriculture, informing you of continuing education credits now required from the state to keep your license current. For most license holders, you will need 3 points by June 30, 2026. After the first of the year, I will be offering multiple opportunities for certified applicators to earn their needed points prior to the deadline of June 30, 2026.
